25 Years of the Jacques Cartier Museum

On June 2, we began the celebrations by inviting our neighbours to a friendly reception. More than 30 people were able to come and see our new installations.



On June 4, the day of the official commemoration of the 25th anniversary, we were honoured to welcome the Canadian Ambassador to France, Mr. Marc Lortie, the Mayor of St-Malo, Mr. René Couanau and more than 200 guests from various cultural, historical and social associations.



Our special guests were given a private tour of the house. Everyone in attendance was able to follow the work that was carried out since the acquisition by the Society of the Friends of Jacques Cartier through a retrospective exhibition.

In 2009, the Macdonald Stewart Foundation was awarded the distinction of Grand Mécène from the Ministry of Culture of France, the first Canadian institution to receive this prestigious award.

To mark this memorable moment a monument was unveiled in the courtyard of the manor to celebrate the unique contribution of Liliane and David M. Stewart to the restoration and preservation of the Jacques Cartier Manor House.



They called me Jacques Cartier



At the beginning of 2009, in cooperation with an international association based in St-Malo Si tous les Ports du Monde and the St-Malo Theatre, a major project was undertaken to produce a spectacular sound and light show.

Entitled " They called me Jacques Cartier" this event was first presented at the end of June to more than 250 people working in the tourism industry. It was later seen by the general public 3 nights a week for a period of two months. More 2300

people saw the show.

Officially greeted by Catherine des Granges, wife of Jacques Cartier, and her maid, the spectators were then ready to go back in time to relive the atmosphere prevailing in the XVI Century.



At night fall, after walking through the exhibition and after seeing a variety of documentaries, spectators were led to the courtyard right in front of the manor.

Suddenly, lights appeared from everywhere. Huge colourful and magical pictures with an accompanying dramatic sound track were projected on the façade of the house. Thus began the trip back in history with Jacques Cartier for the enjoyment of both young and old.



The sound and light show was produced and staged by an internationally renowned French audio-visual company –Spectaculaires Allumeurs d'Images, based in Rennes.

Although the weather was rainy and damp for most of the summer, spectators kept on coming, some on more than one occasion. We believe this event will be even more successful in 2010.
